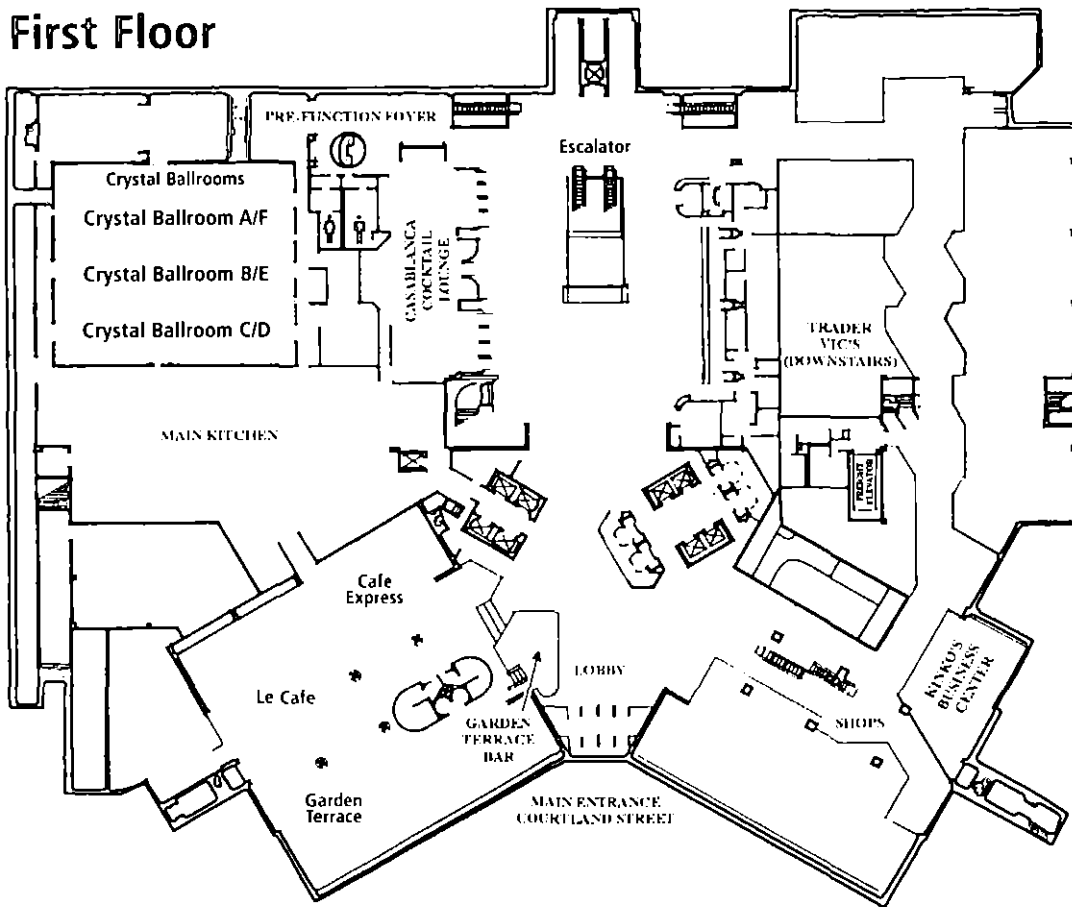

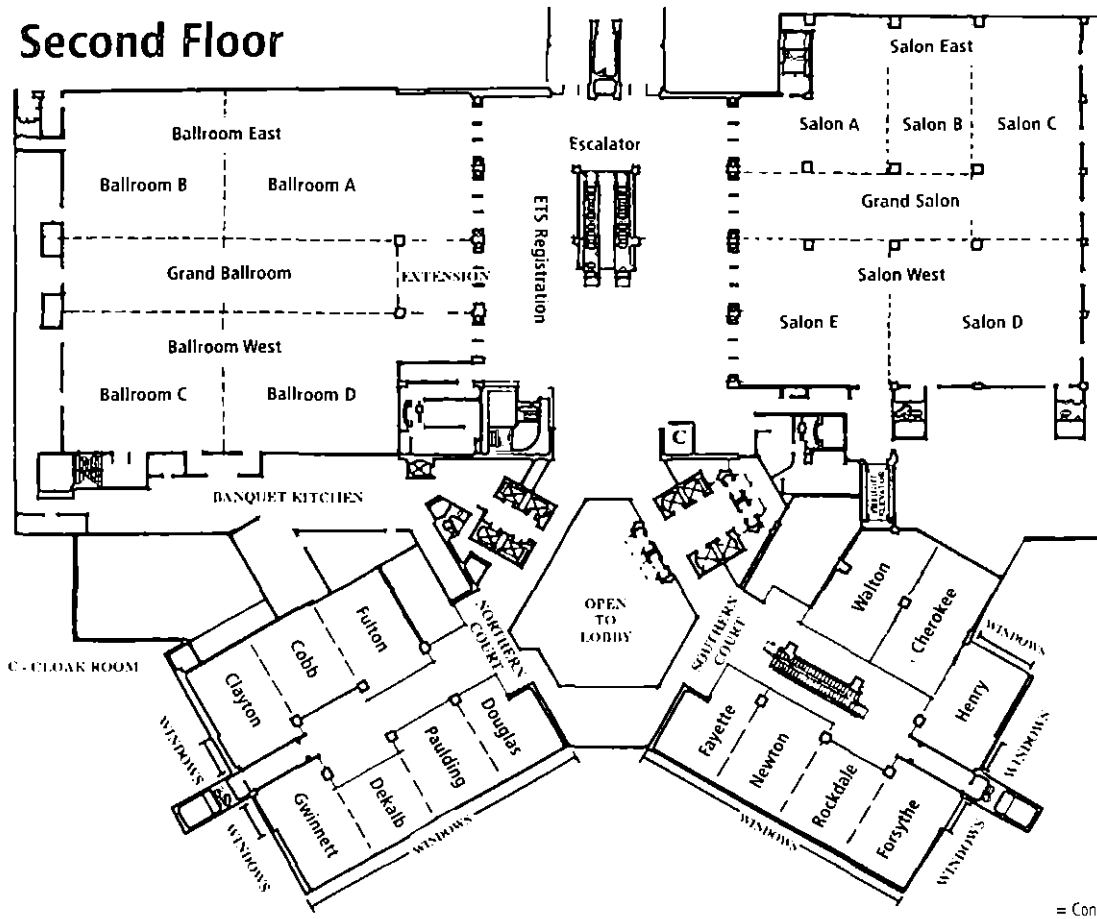

Welcome to the 55th Annual Meeting of the Evangelical Theological Society at the Atlanta Hilton. This year's topic is "Jesus." We have six plenary sessions devoted to the topic, four from a biblical perspective, one from a theological perspective, and one from the viewpoint of the contemporary world, as well as more than 60 papers on the various aspects of the topic. Our presidential address by David M. Howard, Jr. will encourage us about having joy in our Christian lives and in the work of our Christian scholarship.

Our Society continues its healthy growth, both in numbers and in quality of papers. One sign of this is that we have experienced a very encouraging growth of study groups in recent years, each focused on a specific subdiscipline and contributing to in-depth exploration of themes and areas of study in ways not possible previously; twenty-one are meeting this year. In all, more than 300 ETS papers—in study groups and open sessions—are scheduled. Combined with the offerings of our affiliated societies—the Evangelical Philosophical Society, Near East Archaeological Society, and Adventist Theological Society—the overall total is more than 350. Similar to last year, the open papers are grouped by theme or discipline, so that participants will present with others of mutual interest. I would like to extend my appreciation to Barry Danylak, my assistant, for his hard work in managing all the program details, and also to Jason Pranger and Barbara Moser at Zondervan for their fine effort in designing the program.

Our hotel is ideal for our meetings: large enough to accommodate our needs easily, yet small enough to enable easy getting around to sessions. There are good restaurants in the hotel itself, and in several other hotels and stand-alone establishments nearby, as well, catering to every budget. Atlanta is a wonderful city; be sure to check out the information on restaurants and other places of interest. I especially thank Mr. David Bennett, Program Manager, for his logistical support for our meeting. If you have opportunity, please thank him and the entire hotel staff for their services to us.

*may only our God be glorified.*

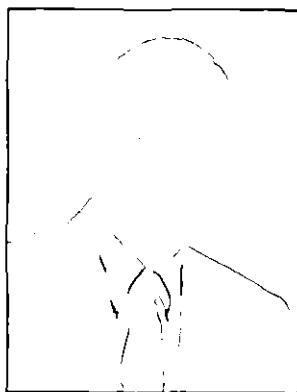

## Public Transportation:

Take the train north and exit at Peachtree Center Station. Take the Harris Street escalator or follow the directions for Peachtree Center Mall. You will go up a very steep escalator into the Mall. Take the walkway from the Mall to the parking garage & Peachtree Center Athletic Club. Take the elevator to the street. The hotel is on your right when you exit the garage.

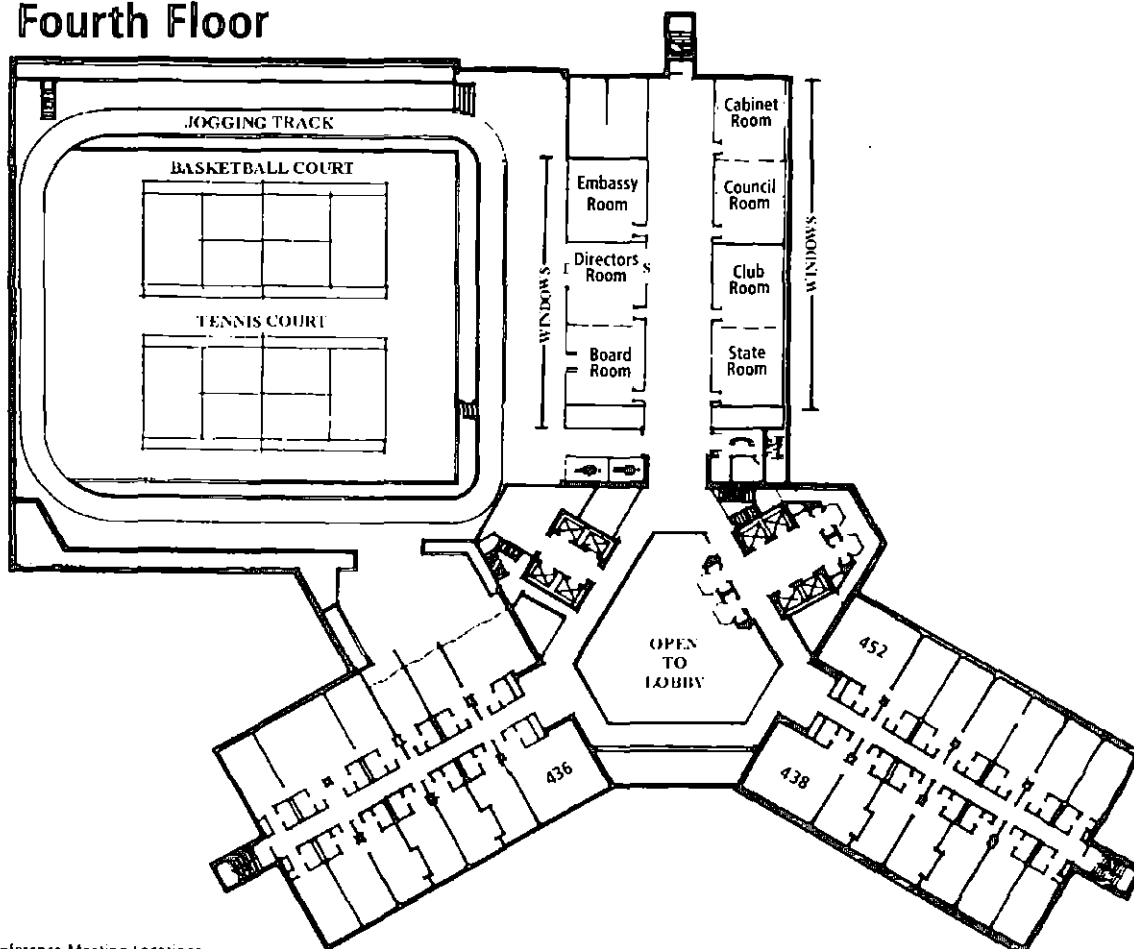


# Atlanta Hilton and Towers Floor Plan — Third and Fourth Floor

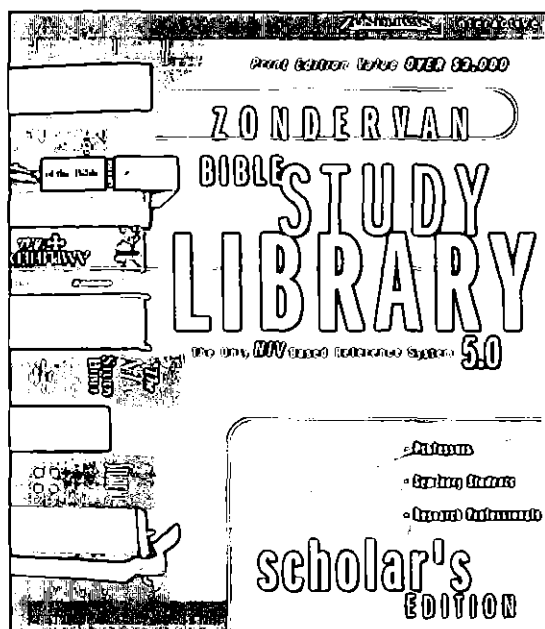


## Fourth Floor

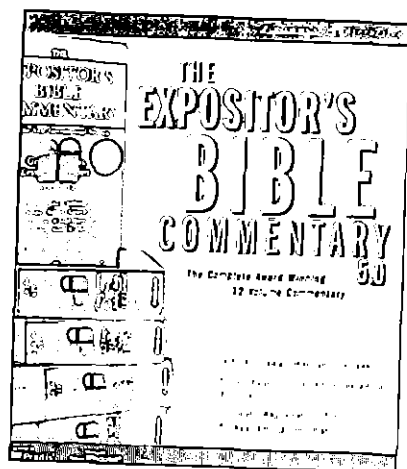

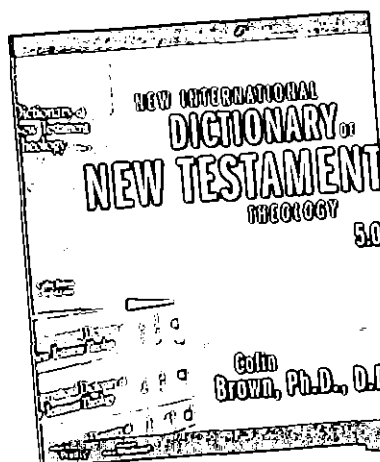

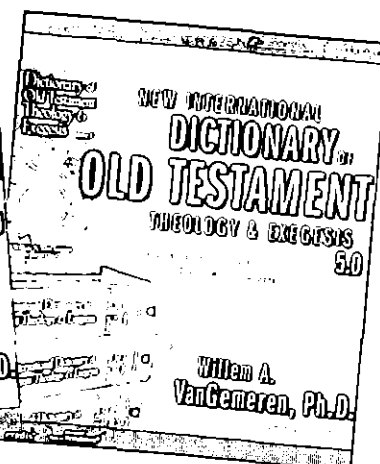
